3. Town crew member Scott Pockat discussed his research regarding creating an access to the Bearskin trail from the east side of U.S. Highway 51 near County D and Mill Road. There is money available to reimburse the town for the project, but it would require the town to cover the whole cost up front, which is estimated to be over \$125,000.00 and then apply for a potential 80% reimbursement. If the public is willing to fund this, then the town would pursue it. As it stands, the town cannot afford to fund this project.
